# Directions for logging in to HEBCurriculum


Note: the enrollment key for all curriculum areas is **heb123**

## **USERNAME (ALL USERS)**

Your username is your district issued username - this is the same username you use to login to your school computers. (Example: ke123456)

## **PASSWORD (EXISTING USERS)**

This is the password you have selected, which may or may not be the same as your network password. In the event that you have forgotten it, simply click the "Lost Password?" link and provide the required information.





## **PASSWORD (NEW USERS - NEVER LOGGED INTO THE SYSTEM BEFORE!)**


Your *password* for the system is the *first two letters* of your first name, the *first two letters* of your last name, and the *last four digits* of your Social Security Number.

- **Make sure the first letter of your first and last name is capitalized!**  
(e.g., John Doe with SS number 000121234 would have a password of JoDo1234)

Once you have logged in, you will be prompted to enter a new password. *Your new password must have at least 7 characters, have at least 1 digit, and contain one lower case letter.* If you are not prompted to change your password, you can change it manually by selecting Change password, under the administration block.
